#### SKYRIZI USES<sup>1</sup>

SKYRIZI is a prescription medicine used to treat adults with:

- moderate to severe Crohn's disease.
- moderate to severe ulcerative colitis.

#### SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS<sup>1</sup>

Do not use if you are allergic to SKYRIZI. SKYRIZI may cause serious side effects, including serious allergic reactions, an increased risk of infections, and liver problems.

- Stop using SKYRIZI and get emergency medical help right away if experiencing symptoms of a serious allergic reaction.
- Before starting treatment, your doctor should check for infections and tuberculosis. Tell your doctor right away about any infections or symptoms of infection and about planned or recent vaccines.
- Liver problems may happen while being treated for Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis that can lead to hospitalization. Your doctor will do liver blood tests before and during treatment and may stop SKYRIZI if liver problems develop.

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# SKYRIZI **INFUSIONS**


SKYRIZI treatment starts with **3** intravenous (IV) infusions: **1 every 4 weeks**, as prescribed by your doctor. After completing your third infusion, you will start using the SKYRIZI On-Body Injector (OBI) according to your prescribed treatment plan.

## Maintenance subcutaneous injections will start 4 weeks after your third infusion; each dose is taken 8 weeks apart. After receiving

you can administer your treatment at home using the prefilled cartridge with the SKYRIZI On-Body Injector (OBI).

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### **HOW TO PREPARE**




Schedule all of your SKYRIZI infusions in advance. That way, you can plan ahead for time off from work and arrange transportation. You can write down the dates on your Infusion Prep Guide or keep track in the Skyrizi Complete App.



Watch for phone calls or other communications from your insurance company, infusion provider, or specialty pharmacy to confirm you're all set for your SKYRIZI infusion. These communications may come from a phone number or email address that is new to you.



Make a list of your current medications and supplements. A healthcare provider may ask about them when you arrive at your treatment location.





#### **Helpful Tip**

Try to get a good night's rest before your treatment and drink plenty of water.

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#### **BEFORE** YOUR SKYRIZI INFUSION

Each infusion may take at least 1 hour for Crohn's disease (CD) and at least **2 hours** for ulcerative colitis (UC), so you may want to bring a book to read or a device to catch up on your shows.

If you prefer to rest during your infusion, consider bringing a blanket if you think it would be more comfortable.

Remember, your infusion provider will need access to your arms. If you wear a sweater or long-sleeved shirt, make sure you'll be able to roll up the sleeve or pull your arm out of it entirely.





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


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### **DURING YOUR SKYRIZI INFUSION**

When you first arrive for your infusion treatment, your infusion provider may take your temperature or blood pressure.

As you get ready for the infusion, you'll want to **make sure you're comfortable**. Remember, each infusion may take at least **1 hour** for Crohn's disease (CD) and at least **2 hours** for ulcerative colitis (UC).

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
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#### **AFTER YOUR SKYRIZI INFUSION**

## SKYRIZI ON-BODY INJECTOR


Once you've completed your SKYRIZI infusions, you will begin using the SKYRIZI On-Body Injector (OBI)—a device that injects your medicine just under your skin. SKYRIZI is available in 180 mg/1.2 mL or 360 mg/2.4 mL subcutaneous injection via the OBI.

Your first SKYRIZI OBI injection will be 4 weeks after your third infusion. A healthcare provider should show you how to properly inject before you start injecting on your own. You will then inject every 8 weeks, as prescribed by your doctor. You may inject at home or at your doctor's office.



## **Ongoing support throughout your SKYRIZI treatment**

#### SKYRIZI may lower the ability of your immune system to fight infections and may increase your risk of infections.

Your healthcare provider should check you for infections and tuberculosis (TB) before starting treatment with SKYRIZI and may treat you for TB before you begin treatment with SKYRIZI if you have a history of TB or have active TB. Your healthcare provider should watch you closely for signs and symptoms of TB during and after treatment with SKYRIZI. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you have an infection or have symptoms of an infection, including:

- fever, sweats, or chills - cough - shortness of breath
- blood in your mucus (phlegm) muscle aches

- diarrhea or stomach pain

- warm, red, or painful skin or sores on your body different

- burning when you urinate or urinating more often than normal

It is not known if SKYRIZI passes into your breast milk. • become pregnant while taking SKYRIZI. Liver problems may happen while being treated for Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis: A person with Crohn's disease who received SKYRIZI through a vein in the arm developed changes in liver blood tests with a rash that led to hospitalization.

Your healthcare provider will do blood tests to check your liver before, during, and at least up to 12 weeks of treatment, and

may stop treatment with SKYRIZI if you develop liver problems.

These are not all the possible side effects of SKYRIZI. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. Use SKYRIZI exactly as your healthcare provider tells you to use it.
